

Relief in Sindhupalchowk

I am Min Bahadur Lama, a former member of CHITWAN PARIWAR UK. I was handed a certain amount of money to donate the most needy people who were affected by the Earthquake in Sindhupalchowk, Nepal. I was handed a total amount of £ (1,42,320 Rs). After I went there, I saw schools demolished by the Earthquake and I thought I should help the schools. One of the school was “Shree Kalika Primary School” where the classrooms had no proper studying materials. I donated Rs. 62,240 in the school. The locals were extremely happy about how CHITWAN PARIWAR UK supported them in their darkest times. Then, a few kilometers ahead there was another school, Shree Kamaladevi Secondary School. The school had classrooms made of bamboo and no enough studying materials. Some of the rooms had collapsed too and I donated a sum of Rs. 50100 there.

Then, rest of the money was given to a most needy person. Her name was Nir Maya Magar of 78 yrs old. Despite her condition, her hospitality was very good. She offered us fruits (Naspati) which she grew in her own home. Her family was desperately in need of money because of their 10 years old grand-child due to the Earthquake. The child had serious head injury and therefore I felt that the family needed the most help so I granted her family a total amount of Rs. 27,980.

The banner of CHITWAN PARIWAR UK also cost Rs. 2000 which I made it in Kathmandu.

It was all thanks to my nephew Mr. Raj Tamang who is 31 years old and he recently lives in Badegaun, Sindhupalchowk. With his help I was able to visit the schools and the Earthquake affected areas. The reason I didn't donate equal amount of money to both the schools was because the Primary school was not supported by any charity group or organization before so I felt that this specific sum would make a great contribution than the second school which had already been supported by organizations such as “RISE FOR NEPAL” and “ABSOLUTE GURKHA”.

It was a great experience to me and also my family to visit there and help them. Our committee Chitwan Pariwar UK received a lot of gratitude and blessings from the locals of Badegaun, Sindhupalchowk.

Lastly, a teacher from another nearby school requested for additional help but due to limited amount of money I couldn't support him but I assured him that CHITWAN PARIWAR UK will try their best and support his school financially in the future.
